Your potential tax refund could be impacted if one of these errors are made on the D-400 tax return

Ways to prevent errors:



Review instructions Form D-401 before completing the D-400



Review D-400 prior to submitting for:

- Missing or incorrect information
- Damages to the tax forms
- Matching form types
 (Web-Fill, Web, Traditional)
 Include all pages of
 supplemental forms



Use approved software for e-Filing



Utilize e-Filing

to prevent math

errors

Include all taxable income

What to do if an error is made?

File an amended tax return. Generally if File an amended tax return. Generally if additional tax is owed, you should also file the amended return and pay the tax within three years after the original return was filed or within three years from the date required by law for filing the return, whichever is later.
